

YEAR 8 REPORT

Year 9 & 10 Report


Fun Filled FLP on Fridays!





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
CONGRATULATIONS!

Course Counselling


Early in Term 3 Ms Manning and Mr Kaplon will be course counselling all Year 9, 10 and 11 students at their respective course counselling nights

ATTENDANCE & ABSENCES

If students are not at school, they cannot learn. If your child is absent please contact **Sharyn Collins (8769 1086)** and **provide their HG teacher with a note** upon their return or amend the absence yourself by logging onto COMPASS.

If a student is late to school, please provide them with a note and tell them to sign in at the learning team office. If leaving school early, students must also sign out at the Learning Team office prior to leaving the *school*

Please note: *Students completing Year 11 or 12 subjects are to have no more than 6 unexplained periods per subject per semester, otherwise they put themselves at risk of not passing their subjects.*

UNIFORM

Please ensure your child abides by the college uniform policy, this includes white socks for girls with the Summer uniform and navy blue socks with their Winter uniform. Boys should be wearing Grey socks at all times if your child is out of uniform (incorrect shoes, pants, top or socks) please provide a note from home and ask their HG to sight and sign it. If students arrive to school without a note they will receive and after school detention
