Camps, Sport and Excursion Fund (CSEF)

If you hold a means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you **may be eligible** for CSEF of \$225 per year. The allowance is paid directly to the school and **can only** be used towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of the student. It can be put towards the College Council's Sport/Activities fee as well as outdoor education, basketball and dance academies.

The allowance cannot be used for unit or other College Council fees

Dear Parents and Guardians,

As it's time for choosing subjects for 2018, and therefore, time for paying fees, I'd like you to know why we need to charge fees.

We want to provide the best educational programs, extra-curricular activities, resources and facilities for our students. We depend on the financial support of our families, and use these funds specifically for the programs for which they are charged. They pay for items such as paper, educational resources, books and electronic programs. They pay for food in Food Technology, sports equipment and most incursions and excursions. They pay for the resources we strive to provide for your children.

We also work actively for support from the community and we are very fortunate to benefit from the hard work of the Rotary Club of Berwick, and sponsors who support us with the Chaplaincy fund. We benefit from our close relationship with the City of Casey, having access to the Athletics Track, the Leisure Centre, the shared Hockey pitch, Netball courts, Football rooms and oval.

On the page overleaf, you will see the Council Specific fees. They are self-explanatory, but the third of these is sometimes confused with The Building Fund. Fee C helps us look after our buildings, painting etc., while the Building Fund pays for new constructions.

For example, we would like a new shelter built over the amphitheatre to shade and protect students in assemblies and at lunchtimes and recess. We have applied for a grant but even if we are successful, we will need more to build it. This money comes from our Building Fund.

We are also applying for grants to extend the Basketball and Dance facilities and of course, I am still determined to build a future Community Health and Wellbeing centre which will give us a much better and bigger sickbay and wellbeing area, as well as benefitting the community at large.

How can you help? By paying the fees for subjects and the essential fees but also contributing to The Building Fund. We suggest \$40 per family, but any amount is greatly appreciated and is tax deductible.
