The Presentation Evening was a fabulous finish to 2018, showcasing our students' achievements, gifts and talents. **Congratulations to our Dux students: Year 7 Emma Guthrie; Year 8 Holly Moulday; Year 9 Leisha Allen; Year 10 Isabella Imhoff; Year 11 Claire An and Year 12 Madison Gerdan who achieved an ATAR score of 99.4.**

Our Year 12 students received their summary results, with 3 students achieving ATARs above 90, 29 students achieving ATARs above 80.



We also were thrilled to exemplar responses for the required writing styles in VCE English. Our Careers staff were available to discuss with students their results and future pathways. Thank you to the parents and staff for their encouragement of these young adults and we know they will make a positive contribution to the world around them. We are also very grateful for our meaningful partnerships with The City of Casey, ADF, Rotary Club of Berwick, local schools, past staff, TAFEs, universities and businesses in our community.

We have had a number of successful trips overseas this year including Tasmania for the inaugural Year 9 camp and New York for the inaugural Dance Academy excursion. Both events provided students with a life time of experiences, that when combined with the all the outdoor education camps, interschool school sports, musical events, Dance Academy State School Spectacular and Nationals for Basketball and Volleyball, complete the picture of education at Berwick College and the development of the whole child.



The City of Casey awarded our College Nurse, Mrs Tracey Anastasi (*pictured right*) with \$1,500 in recognition of her amazing work in achieving 100% consent card return for the School Immunisation Program which will be used to purchase a wheel chair for our Health Centre. Mr D'Arcy Garton was nominated as an outstanding Monash University Mentor for pre-service teachers.

As reported in our comprehensive Year Book, Kenny finally managed to knock Chisholm of the top spot and claim their inaugural Learning Team Cup, and with Chisholm Learning Team coming a close second. Students in their Learning Teams over the course of the year have raised money in their service projects for many excellent causes. BERWICK COLLEGE STEAM TEAM

We are so excited to update everybody on our progress in the STEAM Team.

Earlier this year, a team of four year 9s, **Mor, Holly, Chandler** and **Alex** began a STEM project where they created a video game. It was for a nationwide competition for all schools, called the "Australian STEM Video Game Challenge". In two weeks, their team banded together to create levelled puzzle game titled "Blobbo VS the World" using the programming App GameMaker. They each had individual jobs, including character and background creation, level design, coding and programming. They learned to work under pressure with a time limit and learned how to work and communicate as a team to create an awesome product. They received a certificate for all of their hard work, well done to you all!

Another student in the STEAM Team, **George** is working on a magnetic powered car. He is using 3D programming applications "Tinkercad" and "Adobe Illustrator" to help him design certain features of his car in order to use the 3D printer as well as the laser cutter down in Technology. George also used the slicing software "Cacoon Create" in order to input into the 3D printer. At the moment he is using trial and error to create the steering component of his car as well as a car track that ensures that the magnets will function optimally with the chosen materials and have good aesthetics.

Mitchell A is working on creating his very own language which is very impressive. His language is called "Kwekrî" where all the syllables start with K. Using a program called "Graded Sentences for Analysis" he has created 26 letters and can count to 12 so far. Number one is Ko and number two is KU. So far he has 50 words, for example "Kîd" is the sun and "KekA" is hello. Mitch has created nine sentences, for example the wind blows is "konz ku klekonko". He aims to have 50 sentences by the end of the year. Mitchel is also aiming to use coding and programming to create an application to teach someone his language. He is also going to use the *MyDictionary* application to create his own dictionary and the *Lang Quiz* application to create a language quiz to test his friends.

Our two Subs in School Teams have made great progress in making their Underwater Remote Operated Vehicles (ROVs). Team 1 are **Sarah, Mitchell H, Leisha, Elvin** and **Mae** and Team 2 are **Anthony, Liam, Cassie, Hadar** and **Lachlan**. Students have used their research skills, using text books such as "Making underwater ROV's" to find resources for building submarines. The teams put together a parts list and have shopped at Bunning's Warehouse. Students are currently using their wiring and circulatory knowledge to wire their submarines. This will enable them to test them in early 2019. Following this we will be entering State and national competitions in the hope of winning in one of the categories presented.

We are so proud of all STEAM Team this year and we cannot wait to see what next year brings!

BERWICK COLLEGE MENTOR PROGRAM 2019 TRAINING

I am excited to announce that Berwick College has about 200 students across the Learning Teams that have been trained and are raring to go!

The Mentor Program aims to help Year 7s make a smooth transition into high school life and help them to build more resilience and confidence. It aims to support mentors in developing their skills and lead a group of people by developing their communication skills and confidence through the responsibility of working with younger students. The program endeavours to build relationships between students of all ages and to make sure that everyone understands and respects that differences and individuality should be celebrated, rather than negative instances of bullying and exclusion.

Each Mentor completed two double period training sessions in Week 8 of Term 4 during Head start. The Tuesday session focused on what the role of the Mentor is and congratulating them on taking the first step together to make a difference in other young people's lives. The current Mentors from the Frost Learning Team (pilot program 2018) went through some of the awesome activities that they did to help the new students build some skills and to give them ideas on how to encourage the year 7s, or what they have affectionately been re-named to as ducklings. The Wednesday session was about further developing these skills with Sue, Steve, Jen and Hannah from Youth Out Loud. They presented on "Respond-ability" and "W.I.F.L.S" or "What I feel like saying". I am so proud to say how impressive all of the students were in their enthusiasm, positivity and listening skills.

There was also a pancake breakfast for all of the Mentors at the completion of their training, as well as a whole school assembly with their peers, parents and teachers. To assist your child with transition, the following ideas may be helpful:-

- Encourage your child to discuss the future transition by asking questions such as, "What have you been thinking about your new school?" Make a list of your child's concerns and together try to find answers to the questions.
- Let your child know it is natural to feel apprehensive. He or she may be fearful of not being accepted by peers or about mastering the logistics or academics of a new school. Share childhood memories of times when you were worried about a new situation. Relate the good things that happened like how you met your best friend or that your new teacher was one of your favourites.
- Keep the days leading up to the start of Year 7 as positive as possible. Stress that his or her class will offer many new experiences. The night before the first day, have your child lay out everything needed for school. The next morning allow time to get ready in a calm manner.
- It will take time for your child to settle in and we are here to help. Your child's Student Learning Leader and Home Group Teacher are there to assist. Ask questions and it is OK that you make mistakes, the biggest part of making a mistake is that you learn from them and become a better person.



VTAC FEES

There are still some Year 12 students who haven't paid their VTAC fee. This will need to be paid online via their VTAC account if they want to be considered for a TAFE or University offer. Please contact the Careers Centre for assistance.

OFFERS AND ENROLMENT

Year 12 students can view their offers via their VTAC account. To accept their offer, they must enrol in the course. Enrolment procedures will be outlined in the email sent by the relevant institution. There are 5 rounds of offers, and the relevant dates can be found at <https://vtac.edu.au/dates.html#Year12> however the majority of students will only receive one offer in January.

YEAR 12 ORIENTATION, 2019

Year 12 VCE students will be attending an orientation day on Friday 1st February, 2019. Students will meet at Federation University, Berwick for a 9am start, and the day should conclude by 3.30pm. We have a lot of fun activities planned and lunch will be provided.

Year 12 VCAL students will be invited to attend an orientation camp at Kilcunda Caravan Park. This event will run over two fun-packed days (11th and 12th Feb), and students will have an opportunity to chat to their Year 12 teachers, and Careers staff will be there to discuss their future aspirations.






