

Return to school

Student Information



Dear students,

We hope that you have had a positive experience during the period of remote learning. It certainly has been a learning curve for both yourselves and your teachers! We have heard many amazing stories that have illustrated how well you have adapted to these new circumstances and supported your peers. The College values of resilience and co-operation have been well-demonstrated and we could not be prouder!

As we approach a return to school, we have a few guidelines that we would like you to consider before you return. These guidelines are designed to ensure that we can keep everyone at school safe and well. If you have any queries, please do not hesitate to contact your Homegroup teacher.

Back-to-school guidelines:

- Onsite schooling for Years 11 and 12 will commence onsite classes on Tuesday, 26th of May. Years 7-10 will commence from Tuesday, 9th of June.
- The remote learning bell times will remain until Tuesday, 9th June. They will then return to normal.
- If you are unwell, it is important that you stay home from school and have your parent/guardian notify the College.
- Teachers will be supplied with hand sanitiser to take to each of their classes for you to use. However, it is highly recommended that you also bring along your own personal supply of hand sanitiser.
- In practical classes, you will be able to share equipment but should practise good hygiene by using hand sanitiser or washing hands before and after the class.
- You should bring your own water bottle for use at school as you will not be able to drink directly from drinking fountains at this time. Taps may be used to refill water bottles.

- The canteen will be open as per normal. Please make sure that there is no sharing of food and please use an EFTPOS card, if possible.
- If you choose to stay home, your teacher will not provide remote learning classes. However, you will be able to access your schoolwork via Compass or Google classroom.
- Buses to and from school will be running as normal. Once again, it is important that you practise good hand hygiene before and after catching school transport.
- No camps, excursions or interschool sport will take place during Terms 2 and 3.
- Only non-contact sports will be played during Physical Education classes.
- Students are not required to practise social distancing.
- You are expected to adhere to the College's mobile phone policy upon your return to school. Remember to clean your mobile phone daily.
- Make sure that you return and provide prescribed medication to the College Nurse so that we can store it safely for you and ensure that it is administered as required.
- Make sure that you speak to someone such as your Homegroup teacher if you need a safe place to raise your concerns and feelings.

Information for Year 10 students

If you are undertaking a Year 11 subject or a VET subject, you should, as much as possible, come to school for your Year 11 or VET subject. If you need to remain at school, you can attend your regular Year 10 classes in your normal timetabled room and work remotely with your Year 10 teacher.

If you are undertaking a VET course external to the school, please note that all providers will advise students directly about when they will move from remote learning to face to face, on-site teaching.
