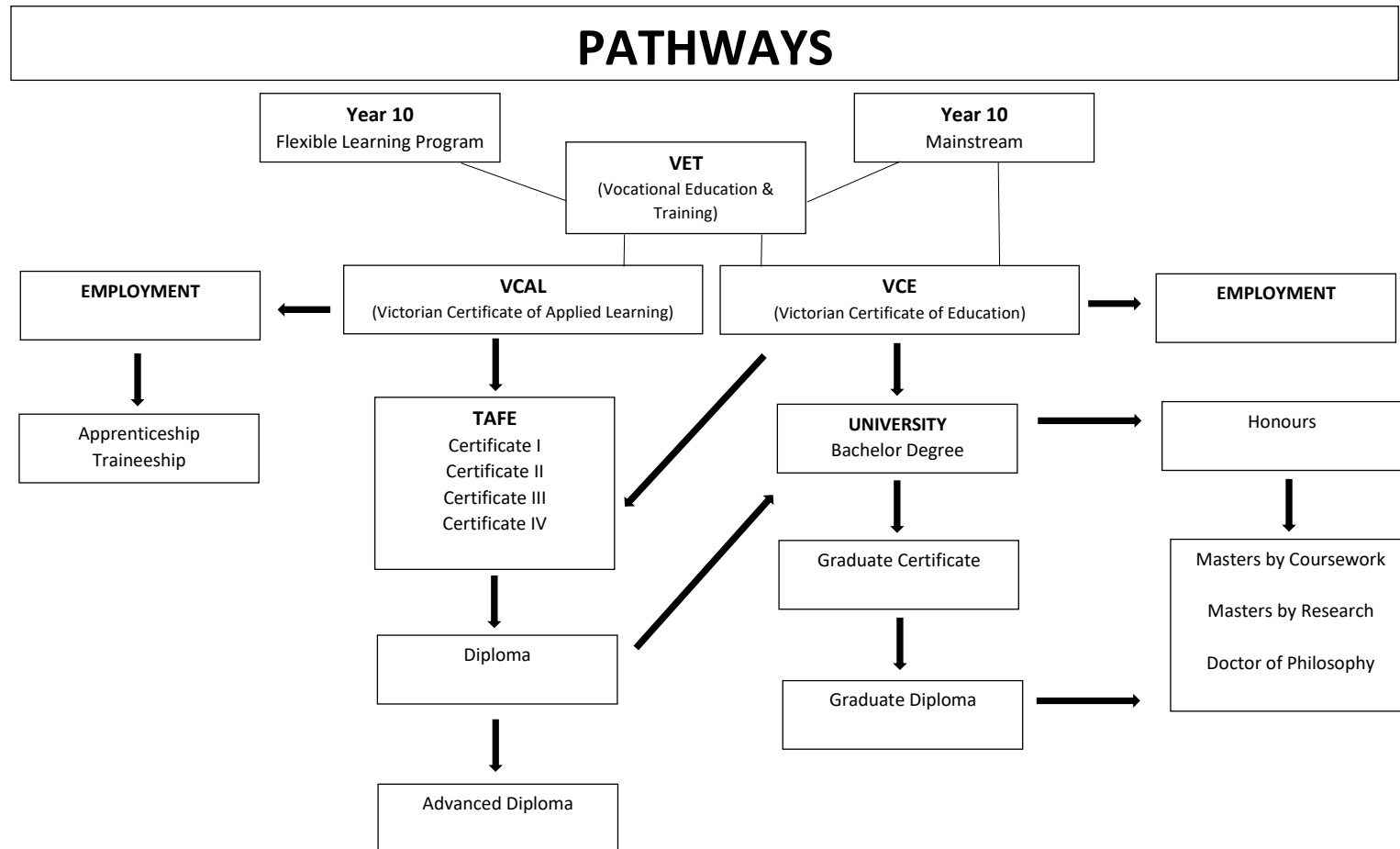
Year 10 at Berwick College

In year 10, students can study:

- + Mainstream
- + Mainstream with a VET course (exception of Chisholm TAFE).
- + The Flexible Learning Program (which includes a VET course)



Pathways at Berwick College



Year 10 Mainstream

For the year, mainstream Year 10 students complete 12 subjects in total, which includes:

- + Compulsory English (1 unit each Semester)
- + Compulsory Mathematics which is allocated by your 2021 results (1 unit each Semester)
- + Compulsory Game of Life (one unit in either Semester 1 or Semester 2)
- + 7 elective units (3 in one Semester and 4 in the other Semester)



Mainstream and VCE Units

- + Some students will have received a letter of recommendation to study a VCE subject in year 10. This is based on Year 9 results, recommendations from teachers and PAT-R results.
- + Course Counsellors will have this information at the time of Course Counselling appointments.
- + It allows students to complete one Unit 1 and 2 subject in Year 10, which is usually followed up by Units 3 and 4 in Year 11.

Benefits:

- + Experience of VCE study requirements
- + Six Year 12 subjects (most year 12's would complete 5)
- + Contribution to the ATAR

Flexible Learning Program

Timetable on a Monday, Tuesday and Thursday

- + 4 Periods of Maths
- + 4 Periods of English
- + 5 Periods each of 2 Electives per Semester (1 of these including Game of Life which is compulsory)

Flexible Learning Program

- + VET Course of your choice either at school, or at a separate TAFE / institution.

VCAL TRANSITION UPDATE

- + Victoria is transforming the delivery of senior secondary education with the introduction of a single senior secondary certificate that will offer greater access to quality vocational and applied learning pathways for all students.
- + The senior secondary education reforms aim to provide access to education and training that is relevant, engaging and that delivers in-demand skills for the future world of work, ensuring that students can access education that leads to employment.
- + Next year students will still be able to enrol in either the Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning (VCAL) or the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE). The following year, in 2023, VCAL students will be enrolled in the new VCE Vocational Specialisation

Considerations when choosing your 2022 Pathway...

Mainstream	Flexible Learning Program
Plan to go to university or complete a course that requires an ATAR should select an appropriate mainstream course.	Do not require VCE/ATAR to pursue further areas of study should consider Flexible Learning Program (FLP).
Would like a taste of a career option offered through VET programs should consider a VET program as part of their mainstream course.	Plan to complete their secondary education and then enter the workforce should consider Flexible Learning Program (FLP).
Are unsure about their future plans should select mainstream (it leaves all options open).	Plan to do a trade should consider an appropriate VET program and Flexible Learning Program (FLP).

Vocational Education and Training (VET)



Vocational Education and Training (VET)

- + Vocational Education and Training (VET) programs in the VCE or VCAL allows students to include vocational studies within their senior secondary certificate.
- + Each qualification provides an opportunity for students to develop an awareness of the world of work and develop employability skills that will contribute to their career development journeys.
- + Students undertake nationally recognised training from nationally accredited training packages which contribute to their VCE or VCAL.

Vocational Education and Training (VET)

- + VET is optional in year 10 and VCE but essential in VCAL.
- + VET courses range from 1-2 years in duration.
- + Some courses are held at Berwick College and other courses are held externally.

VET and Year 10 Mainstream program

- + Any mainstream Year 10 students who choose a VET course will inevitably have a clash in their timetable.
- + They will be put into a VET English clash to minimise clashes and ensure they don't miss any English classes.
- + It is the student's responsibility to catch up on the periods missed while they are completing their VET course.

- + Certificate II in Applied Fashion Design and Technology
- + Certificate II in Automotive Vocation Preparation
- + Certificate II in Construction Pathways
- + Certificate II in Community Services
- + Certificate II in Dance (with selected Units from Cert III Dance)
- + Certificate II in Electrotechnology
- + Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation
- + Certificate II in Small Business
- + Certificate II in Visual Arts

- + Appointments should be made online via Compass, preferably with Student Learning Leader or Assistant Student Learning Leader.
- + Students currently in the Flexible Learning Program (FLP) will complete their Course Counselling in class time with Applied Learning staff Mr Walton and Mrs Duhau.
- + If you are interested in the FLP program, you should book your appointment with the Applied Learning staff.
- + Compass bookings will open on Monday 12th July and close on Friday the 30th of July.



Before the appointment

- + Parents and students should read the Senior School Curriculum Guide on the College website and fill in the selection form prior to their interview and have this with you during your course counselling appointment.
- + When choosing subjects, ensure you understand what each subject is about.
- + Look ahead: If you are considering studying VCE in 2023, consider any pre- requisite subjects you may need to study in Year 10 (i.e. Maths and Science)
