

Principal's Report

Welcome back to the 2021 school year for Berwick College.

Our school community has made a strong start to the year, continuing to show the perseverance and resilience evident last year, especially in our abrupt change to three days of remote and flexible learning. As we did last year, we will do all we can to support the wellbeing of all our students and to ensure that, as much as possible, learning continues.

Since we started just three short weeks ago, we have had a very successful year 12 Orientation Day at Federation University, whole school photographs and a whole staff PD on anaphylaxis, mandatory reporting and Child Safe Standards. Students have begun work on their goal setting for the year through the ePortfolio in Home Group. DET COVID 19 guidelines are being followed with students required to wear a mask on public transport and indoors and density limits are required for staff.

It was a positive first whole school assembly on Monday 1st February chaired by our 2021 College Captains, Alyssa, Mae, Trent and Mitchell and Assistant Principal, Mr James Doble where we formally welcomed nine new members of staff, 309 new year 7 students, new students in years 8 - 12 and our year 12s (who enjoyed finally sitting on the steps). I encouraged students to persevere, support each other and make their story a positive story of growth. Berwick College has a great supportive culture, one of growth that embodies our ICARE values Inquiry, Co-operation, Achievement, Resilience and Empathy. When we operate every day under these values, ICARE, our school will flourish.

We reflected on our many successes in 2020 such as:

- The highest median study score ever for the past three years we have been aiming for 30 and we achieved 31. This success can clearly be attributed not only to the year 12 teachers who have done so well, but to all staff who have implemented our interventions over the past few years and to the students who showed such determination.
- Our Dux Jessica Walker gained a score of 97.45
- Nine students achieved ATARs above 90
- Chetan Noor achieved a perfect score in Further Maths
- 5.7% of Study Scores were above 40 and 42 scores of 40 or over
- A 96% pass rate for VCAL students
- The highest score for our year 11s doing a year 12 subject was 48 and 7 of our 40+ scores were for year 11 students
- Katherine Bast's (Alumni 2020) Textiles work will feature in the Emergent Exhibition at Bunjil Place
- Our Business Manager, Mr Juan Hompart was a finalist as Outstanding Business Manager in the Victorian Education Excellence Awards
- Ms Karen Crawley was a finalist as Outstanding Secondary Teacher in the Victorian Education **Excellence Awards**
- Artwork by Maham Umar, Angel Llerena and Adelina Bonifacio (Alumni 2020) will feature in the Emergent Graduate show at Bunjil Place
- VCE Dance achieved first place in the Dance Life Unite Competition and participated in State Schools Spectacular
- Mackenzie Witchell (Alumni 2020) will perform her VET Contemporary solo in Top Class Dance 2021, as part of the VCE Season of Excellence.

It was exciting for our College Nurse, Mrs Tracey Anastasi and the Wellbeing Team to move into our new Health and Wellbeing Centre. Although we have not had our official opening, this new facility is being enjoyed by staff and students.

Our student numbers are currently 1669 which may lead to some class and staffing adjustments, especially around the year 9 classes. The Southern Melbourne Area Principal Forum on Friday 19th February will focus on the DET Priorities, particularly the implementation of the Tutor Learning Program.

This week we congratulated our 2020 Year 12s at their Celebration of Achievement Ceremony. Destination Data for our graduates notes some of the following pathways: Bachelor of Commerce, Arts, Business, Computer Science, Criminal Justice, Criminology, Design, Education, Exercise and Sports Science, Health Sciences, Industrial Design, Information Technology, Media, Nursing, Occupational Therapy, Photography, Psychology, Science, Screen Media and Social Work. Students have also been accepted in Certificate and Diploma courses, work placements and apprenticeships.



Year 7 ICARE Day was held to build positive connections between staff and students as part of our transition to high school processes. The Amazing Race and digital scavenger hunt saw students tearing around the hockey field and school grounds having a great time. My thanks to Mrs Michelle Lewis, the Junior School Coordinator, Assistant Principal Mr James Doble, staff from wellbeing and student leaders who helped prepare for and provide support to ensure the day ran smoothly. Meet the Learning Team afternoon provides our new families the opportunity to develop a supportive relationship with the Home Group teacher and Learning Team leaders, discuss how their child has settled into the school and ensure communication platforms are accessible.

Council Election information has been sent to our school community with vacancies for Parent, DET and student membership. I am grateful for the membership and service of the council members. Together with the staff, parents and students, they play a significant part in building this wonderful school and its culture. My thanks to Mrs Sharron Pitchford for her three years of parent service; Mr Brett Farley, Mr Tim Shambrook and Ms Michelle Walters for their two years of parent service; Mr Jim deVries for his 17 years of DET service and student members Adelle Pool and Samantha Buntrock for their two years of student service. I look forward to inducting our new members at our AGM on Tuesday 16th March.

In 2021 we are focussed on having a productive and successful year for our students, staff and families.

We will continue to communicate changes affecting our school community and events that have been rescheduled, such as camps and excursions, as soon as practical.

Edwin Flack Master Plan—Have your say....

We are pleased to inform you that Council Administrators have given the approval to place the draft Edwin Flack Reserve Master Plan up on public exhibition for further community consultation.

The Master Plan Report, displaying the draft concept plan as well as outlining the proposed changes and projects, is now visible on the Casey Conversations website and will remain open until **March 2.** We welcome all members of the community to provide their feedback on what

has been developed and we ask you for your assistance in promoting this to your players/participants, members/supporters, families etc. by directing them to the link below.

We hope to gain valuable feedback to ensure we are meeting the needs of all users and broader community within the plan.

Stadium Extension Proposal

The Edwin Flack Reserve is on the southern boundary of our College and our College Council has had committee and school members meeting regularly regarding the enhancement of this reserve. In the year 2000, our past students and staff were a part of welcoming the Olympic Torch relay through the reserve.

Items 25, 27, 28 of the Edwin Flack Master Plan note our proposed future Stadium extension. Our Principal, Ms Kerri Bolch has been seeking financial support from the Department of Education and Training and the government to help provide this resource for our school and the local community. The College has flat and vacant land adjacent to the existing stadium and infrastructure is already in place to support this extension with minimum impact to our lovely school environment.

The stadium extension would provide opportunities for physical and social activities and health benefits to our College community and local population.

We have a strong partnership with the City of Casey and the proposal is strongly endorsed by Basketball Victoria and our local sporting clubs.

The stadium extension is part of the Casey Basketball Association Master Plan which has over 700 domestic teams, over 6,500 participants and 1 million annual visitors.

Berwick Basketball Club President, Mr Matthew Loukas has written a letter of support as this would provide sufficient indoor courts in the Berwick area for the anticipated growth over the next 10 years.

The extension would also include an additional purpose built Dance Studio on the Mezzanine level for our growing numbers of Dance Academy students.

Although this extension could cost around \$8 million or more, our College Council believes the seamless and planned integration of sport and education is an invaluable investment in the health and wellbeing of future generations of young people and the wider community.

Ms Bolch will continue to raise the needs of the community with members of parliament and if our parents could also do the same, we may see our plans come to fruition in the near future.









Year 12 Orientation Day

On Friday, 29th of January, the year 12 VCE students attended their Orientation Day at Federation University.

The students heard from Ms Snowball and Mr Garton about the year to come, and the expectations of them for the year.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

S.T.E.A.M Team

We are excited to announce that STEAM will be back again this year, better than ever!

STEAM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics which are incorporated together in everyday challenges that help promote problem solving, collaboration and communication, critical and analytical thinking, as well as creativity.

There are numerous jobs that involve STEAM subjects; for instance, being an electrician, fashion designer, accountant, plumber, architect, pilot, doctor, nurse, astronaut, vet, engineer, computer scientist, IT specialist, urban planner, website designer, forensic scientist, dentist, animator and environmental scientist (to name just a few) that all involve science, technology, engineering, art and mathematics. These jobs can be reached via TAFE and University pathways.

- STEAM occupations have grown three times faster than non-STEAM occupations in the last ten years
- Between 2017 and 2027, the number of STEAM jobs is estimated to grow 13 percent, compared to 5-9 percent for non-STEAM jobs
- STEAM workers command higher wages, earning 26 percent more than their non- STEAM counterparts.

Our afterschool program will be running in D13 this year where we have had an awesome renovation to create a makerspace for our students. So far we have repurposed old whiteboards for table tops, painted some tables with chalkboard paint, put up a lego base wall, as well as a corkboard wall. We are looking forward to some more great ideas from our students such as using LED strip lights and nano leaf. Students will have access to virtual reality, 3D printers, green screens, lego robots, laser cutters, Arduino boards and more.



We will have two streams in STEAM this year: a competition and a challenge stream. Some of the competitions that we hope to be involved in

are Subs in Schools, F1 in Schools, First Lego League, STEM Video Game Challenge and Challenge4Climate Action. The Challenge stream will do smaller and larger projects such as coding and creating lego robots, camera obscura, light up clothes and headbands, Arduino boards and gadgets, pulling apart computers, vertical gardens and hydroponics, sustainability problem solving, creating video games and apps and launching weather balloons into the atmosphere.

We have had sign ups this week and look forward to having a team picture soon. We are also looking forward to having the "New logo and name for STEAM" competition in the upcoming weeks. Landing Patterns at Berwick College

What is your morning landing pattern, right after you get to work? Is it getting the same car park? A coffee on the way to work? Checking emails as soon as you arrive? It is highly likely that this same pattern of events remains consistent daily, weekly and yearly. Now imagine that you are blocked from completing one or two of these things on any particular morning. Often it can make us feel uneasy, nervous or even ill prepared for the day ahead. It is the same experience for your child at school.

Remote learning highlighted the need for staff and students to adapt to a changing world. It was a valuable time as it demanded schools to reflect on the value of routine, development of productive learning environments and teaching students 21st Century skills which would allow them access to learning.

On the back of this, our College has begun to deliver a new process to students which will address each of these areas. At Berwick College, students will begin a new morning routine in homegroup called a 'Landing Pattern'. This is largely driven by Berwick College's belief that as educators we have an obligation to prepare students with the practical skills and behaviours they will need outside of school, in a workplace and beyond.

What is a Landing Pattern?

A landing patten is a set series of behaviours that are typically performed in regular, successive order which allow an individual the opportunity to settle into an environment or prepare for a task. In essence, students at Berwick College are developing a series of specific morning routines which will act to develop 21st Century skills while concurrently allowing a more established preparedness for their day.

Why are routines important?

Routines are well documented in their benefits for an individual. It has been suggested that:

- A routine helps to simplify a complex environment and inform students exactly what to expect.
- Routines help to create smoother transitions between activities and therefore allow fewer opportunities for disruptions to occur.
- When students are expected to complete routine tasks, they have the opportunity to learn greater responsibility and more self-management skills.
- Creating predictable scenarios through routine allows your mind to adjust by knowing what is going to happen, therefore, alleviating anxiety over the unknown.
- Routine helps alleviate stress. Creating routines will allow you to set times for specific tasks and allow you to set times for fun.

What does the Landing Pattern look like at Berwick College?


Landing Patterns will specifically take place every morning in homegroup, with an expected time of around 5 minutes.

When a student gets to class, it is expected that the teacher will begin with 'Good Morning students, please open your devices and begin your landing patterns.'

At this point students will:

- 1. Check emails (send, receive)
- 2. Check Compass (room changes? due dates? CRT?)
- 3. Check Google Classroom (if applicable).

Applied Learning

Year 9 Flexible Learning Program (FLP)

On Thursday the 4th of February the year 9 Flexible Learning Class visited Lysterfield Lake to partake in a beginner downhill mountain bike riding session, and to conduct a fire fuel analysis of vegetation as part of their unit on Australian ecosystems.

Students began the day learning how to conduct a safety check on the bikes, followed by a crash course in manoeuvring skills. The students demonstrated how to ride at speed on off-road terrain using a range of breaking techniques and gear changes. Once at Lysterfield the students were shown the 20km route involving one steep hill and a variation of turns and declines.

Throughout the ride the students stopped at various locations and analysed fuel loads, looking at different layers of vegetation. The students were able to determine areas that were prone to bushfires, with heavy fuel loads on the surface level through to the canopy, and areas that had been well maintained.

To finish off the day the students had a dip in Lysterfield Lake, which was well deserved after the long ride in the hot conditions.


Meet the Learning Team night was held on the 11/2 at the College for the parents and guardians of all new

A huge focus for all Learning Teams in 2021 is **attendance**. If your son or daughter is absent, it is important that you log on to Compass and put through the reason for their absence. An SMS text message is sent if your child is absent and no contact with the school has been made. Through Compass you can also monitor your child's attendance to individual periods, as well as see if they are arriving late to class. Also, if your child is going to be away for a period of time, please notify your home group teacher so that arrangements can be made to support your child to stay up-to-date.




