### **Principal's Report**



### "We are a large school but a tight and caring community"

We were all so pleased to have our young people and staff back onsite after we found ourselves responding to the Premier's announcement of restrictions and remote learning for our students on Thursday, 15th July. Students and staff had begun third term very well. Throughout lockdown our teaching and wellbeing staff have been proactive, contacting students, providing resources, maintaining class routines, daily checking to ensure emerging needs are met, and following up queries and concerns from parents.

It was hard for everyone last time, as I think it felt as if it was just going to keep happening. Students, parents and staff felt a weariness, frustration and resignation, and it showed. We started calling when students were missing from classes, but recognising the stress that was causing for some families, we reverted to text, to keep everyone informed but to remove some of the pressure. We were also conscious of getting students back to school who may have been at risk of not wanting to come back. Some were worried they would be in trouble when they hadn't done the work during lockdown and now we are back in lockdown. People will experience a range of emotions once again, and that is perfectly reasonable. We acknowledge those feelings, but keep in mind this will not be forever.

Wellbeing is affected by accumulated stress and for some, the lockdowns will feel like another brick to carry. Gratitude, mindfulness, exercise in fresh air all help our wellbeing, but assistance from professionals is also sometimes necessary. Please do not hesitate to contact your GP for a Mental Health Plan if you are struggling, or call Lifeline (24/7) 13 11 14, Headspace 1800 650 890 and Kids Helpline (24/7) 1800 551 800. We, as teachers and support staff, will continue to take into account the effects of COVID19 on our students, staff and families. We will help the students catch up, we will stay connected, we will be here and things will get better.

Predictability and mindfulness in these changeable circumstances can provide us all with a greater sense of support and determination to deal with the challenges we face. Knowing what is about to happen, following routines and known processes, means we have less to think about and improves stability. It allows us to focus on the positives that are found in each day and to find those things for which we are grateful. Gratitude and mindfulness both help with our mental health. We are all personally growing through these approaches which helps to build our resilience.

Our teachers know their students, know their expectations and dreams and push their student learner to exceed those expectations and grow. Helping students identify and pursue their goals is a focus of their ePortfolio that is being completed in Homegroup time and is part of our effective careers and transition program.

Students, parents and teachers have begun our course counselling processes. The 2022 Curriculum Guides showcase the rich and varied pathways and programs that are on offer at our College. These study programs aim to optimise pathway options, to engage our students, maximise learning outcomes and stimulate learning. In many cases, the pathways will change over the years, but for now, we want all of our students to have the greatest choices available and ultimately, to be able to make a successful transition into further education, training and employment.

We are well positioned to support our students in their educational journey and this is often evidenced in the feedback we receive from our past students. In this newsletter, we feature one of our alumni from 2005. Mr Chris May has been in touch and is willing to return and support our current students. We are also cheering on our past students who are Olympians, <u>Sergei Evglevski</u> (Class of 2015) and <u>Rebecca Henderson</u> (Class of 2019 Dux) and sending messages of support.

Our College Council and school staff continue to look at ways to highlight the need to expand our current Stadium to accommodate our highly successful Basketball Academy and help provide sufficient indoor courts and infrastructure that the Casey Basketball Association and Berwick Basketball Club have identified as a growing need in our local area. An additional three courts will deliver sport and education benefits for our students and the community. This is part of our College Master Plan which is on the following page of this newsletter. Please do not hesitate to contact me if you would like further information.

When visiting classrooms, I have observed students active in their learning and engaged in contributing positively to the school community. Students continue to be involved in assessments, sporting competitions have now resumed, and planning for camps and tours have continued in earnest. I am grateful to our staff for their flexibility and hard work to support these extra-curricular activities.

The College will be analysing feedback from DET surveys of students, staff and parents to assist us in making important improvements. We will also follow up our own bullying prevention survey which is issued twice a year. We value our school community's views and suggestions. Observations from the hundreds of parents who take part in our school tours, many of whom are past students, are always positive and encouraging. Our School Review to prepare our next Strategic Plan has had to be rescheduled three times but is still anticipated to be completed this term and I look forward to sharing with you the strategies to monitor our progress in improving student outcomes, engagement and wellbeing.

Congratulations to the students who have received or will receive Semester One awards. Although we were not able to hold the celebration evening as a school community it has been lovely to recognise so many students for their outstanding application and achievement. A full list can be found from page 16 of this newsletter. Congratulations to the Frost Learning Team who raised over \$2,500 for 'Safe Steps' Victoria's 24/07 Family Violence Response Centre and my thanks to the Maths Domain for providing fun Maths Week activities in Home group.

In these very difficult times I want everyone to know that we are continuing to work together to help our students to come through this period and to support our families as best we can.



# **School Captain Report**

What is NAIDOC week you may be wondering?

NAIDOC week calls for stronger measures to recognise, protect, and maintain all aspects of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture and heritage.

As a Berwick College school captain, I was able to take part in our school's NAIDOC gathering, which allowed me to celebrate NAIDOC week alongside my peers and teachers. To me, it was an experience that I had never been a part of in the past.

We were all given a Welcome to Country by First Nations Elder, Shane Clarke Snr who welcomed us all to his land. He gave us an incredibly informing insight into First Nation culture. I myself am not from a First Nations background but to be able to recognise and celebrate the history of my fellow students with a First Nations background was a surreal and special moment and not just for me but all other students and teachers who are proud to recognise the Indigenous culture and history.

To hear stories from Shane Clarke Snr about the different welcoming to countries from one Aboriginal territory to another, with the use of different leaves and plants used to

create distinct smells along with other cultural stories, was an awesome eye-opening and hands-on experience that I would highly recommend for future students and teachers to participate in.

As one of the school captains, I feel a certain type of privilege to be a part of this eye-opening cultural event within my own school. After experiencing NAIDOC week celebrations I wish to work alongside the school Koorie Education Program team to further grow and celebrate First Nations culture within the College and throughout the local community.





# South Eastern S.T.E.A.M Club

The South Eastern STEAM Club finished off last term with an awesome bang! Our students had so much fun being designers, explorers, communicators and collaborators. It was such a great opportunity for those students in grades 3, 4, 5, and 6 to come and learn about STEAM and to also see what Berwick College has to offer.

Unfortunately, due to lockdown we did have to cancel a couple of our sessions which saw our lovely students miss out on discovering electricity, and creating light-up jumpers to be ready for Christmas in July, and our session on aerodynamics and the effects of forces on paper planes.

Our students were able to participate in an awesome session on Augmented Reality, Virtual Reality and Game Sprites. Students were grouped into collaborative teams to investigate each of the above topics. They were able to discover the world of virtual reality through headsets, immerse themselves with the joystick functionality and overcome their fears by walking the plank! They learned how to use a Merge Cube in Augmented Reality to make body parts in the human body come alive from 2D to 3D, as well as planets and stars in the solar system. Students were exposed to the App Quiver to use Augmented Reality to look at the lifecycle of the butterfly from 2D to 3D at all the different angles. Lastly students got creative and used the design process to design Game Sprites that could be uploaded to games. We were so impressed again by how awesome and responsible everyone was!

In the last and final week, our students got to create a light bulb terrarium. Students learned about what ecosystems were and how and why terrariums work. They then set to work in laying all of the soil, sand and charcoal followed by water and their specific succulent. They were also allowed to be extra creative and decorate their terrarium with different coloured little rocks and pebbles. Students then had their terrariums sealed and string attached for easy hanging. They were so very excited about their mini ecosystems!

Well done to all of our lovely Grade 3s, 4s, 5s and 6s who participated in the South Eastern STEAM Club in Term 2 this year. We are so proud of how far you have come and how brave and resilient you all are. We were excited to see you use the Design Process and all the skills and knowledge gained in this course in your everyday life!




















### **STEAM***SPACE*



# **Old Melbourne Gaol Excursion**

On the 13th of July, Mrs Lewis and Mr Roberts' year 9 Humanities classes, 9.8 and 9.11, travelled to the Old Melbourne Gaol in the city. We learnt about the different areas of the building, kinds of punishment

and the trial of Ned Kelly.





After the train ride from Berwick to Melbourne Central, we walked to the gaol and started our first activity. It was the reenactment of the trial of Ned Kelly, where we portrayed the key roles in his opportunity to state his case. Next, we went on a tour of the main building. We learnt about the living conditions of the prisoners and the Governor of the gaol. We also learnt about the system of the different levels of the prison (first level - new prisoners and badly behaved, second level - better behaved, top level - best behaved and closer to getting out of incarceration). Then we looked at the different types of punishment such as being hanged, whipped and hard labour. Our last activity was the tour of the watchhouse, guided by a sergeant. The watchhouse is a building where prisoners were taken into custody before their court trials.

A highlight of our experience had to be the trial reenactment. It was a lot of fun portraying the different roles of Ned Kelly's court case.

Another highlight was the tour of the gaol. It was really interesting to learn about the different kinds of punishments and what happens when prisoners are well behaved.

It was an incredible experience!

### Birrarung Marr Stormwater Harvesting - By Punara Alwis Samarakoon (HO1)

On a chilly Wednesday morning on July 14<sup>th</sup>, students arrived at Berwick Station. The two year 7 HAP classes (7.5 and 7.6) headed to the city to do a walking tour to study and learn about the Stormwater Harvesting System at Birrarung Marr.

Booklets and clipboards were handed to each student. The first stop was Federation Square where we had a briefing. We headed to the bank of the Yarra River in Alexandra Park to start off the tour. The first stop was all about saltwater valves where we looked across to the Birrarung Marr. Questions were asked and answers were written on the booklet. We made our way around the river, to the other side where we were able to see the other class at Alexandra Gardens.

At the second stop, we observed the diversion point. This is the part where water is taken from the stormwater drain and diverted into the system. My class were standing on the point of the system, and everyone got a chance to look at the valves clearly. After answering the questions, we walked over to the Bio-filter, located on the Upper Terrace of Birrarung Marr.



This last stop was all about understanding how the dirty stormwater is pumped into the lower terrace and stored in a primary tank. Also, this third stop was to understand one of the questions asked, 'What happens if the Bio-filter wasn't able to purify the water?'

Around 11:45am, both classes were famished and hungry, so we gathered, and walked to Melbourne Central for lunch. Everyone was given about one hour and 10 minutes to have lunch and finish the leftover questions and complete a reflection task. Everyone dug into all kinds of food and lots of people bought bubble tea! Many had seconds for lunch as they were starving!

We took a train around 1:30pm and headed back to Berwick station. Everyone had smiles on their faces; even though they were tired after a long day of walking. After a quiet ride back, everyone was dismissed from the station at 3pm. We all thank Mr Sacco, Mr Connell, Student Teacher Miss Lin and Mrs Hirst for arranging this day for us. Everyone appreciates the hard work the teachers put into this tour to make it fun and engaging.








# **Library News**
