Principal's Report

A warm welcome back to the 2022 school year for Berwick College.

Our school community has made a strong start to the year, continuing to show the perseverance and resilience evident over the past two years. Thank you to all our staff who have once again demonstrated the priority of building positive relationships to ensure our students have had the best possible start to the academic year. Every single one of us has faced challenges over the past two years; challenges with learning, with lockdown at home or coming out of lockdown and learning to be with lots of people all over again. We have had challenges with illness and watching people we care about struggling with illness. Students and staff have received two RAT kits for testing and we will do all we can to support the wellbeing of all our students to ensure that, as much as possible, learning continues.

Information on vaping, alcohol and anxiety will be available to parents and students through forums this year as we focus on wellbeing, particularly to help address the impact of the last two years. We hope this will help with skill development and to build resilience.

Since we started just four short weeks ago, we have had a very successful year 12 Orientation Day at Federation University, whole school photographs and a whole staff PD on anaphylaxis, mandatory reporting and Child Safe Standards.

Our 2022 College Captains, Shae, Maisie, Elijah and Mitchell, addressed the school community at the online assembly where we formally welcomed 26 new members of staff, 333 new year 7 students, new students in years 8 - 12 and our year 12s who commenced their final year of secondary study. I encouraged students to persevere, to support each other and to make their story a positive story of growth. Berwick College has a great supportive culture, one of growth that embodies our ICARE values - Inquiry, Co-operation, Achievement, Resilience and Empathy. When we operate every day under these values our school will flourish.

We reflected on our many successes in 2021 such as:

- Berwick College was recognized as having the best Koorie Education team in the State at the
 Victorian Education Excellence Awards. Our LSOs and Mr Juan Hompart, our Business Manager, were
 also finalists, which means they are in the top three in the State.
- Our Dux for 2021 was Jasmine Colbert and she had an ATAR of 96.65.
- Our 2019 Dux, Rebecca Henderson, competed in the Olympics in Japan last year, racewalking in a 20 km walk along with another past student, Sergei Evglevski, Class of 2015, who competed in the 25m rapid fire pistol shooting event.
- Eight students achieved ATARs above 90
- Scarlett Matulec achieved a perfect score in Media
- 6.26% of Study Scores were above 40

It was exciting for our College Nurse, Mrs Tracey Anastasi, to be recognised for her hard work in ensuring immunisation consent cards were returned for the School Immunisation Program.

We are grateful to the City of Casey for providing this award and cheque to the value of \$1,600 which will help us purchase resources for our Health and Wellbeing Centre and contribute to the Retune student re-engagement program.

accepted into Certificate and Diploma courses, work placements and apprenticeships.















Stadium Extension Proposal Reminder

The Edwin Flack Reserve is on the southern boundary of our College and our College Council has had committee and school members meeting regularly regarding the enhancement of this reserve. In the year 2000, our past students and staff were a part of welcoming the Olympic Torch relay through the reserve.

Items 25, 27 and 28 of the Edwin Flack Master Plan note our proposed future Stadium extension. Our Principal, Ms Kerri Bolch, has been seeking financial support from the Department of Education and Training and the government to help provide this resource for our school and the local community.

The College has flat and vacant land adjacent to the existing stadium and infrastructure is already in place to support this extension with minimum impact on our lovely school environment.

The stadium extension would provide opportunities for physical and social activities and health benefits to our College community and local population.

We have a strong partnership with the City of Casey and the proposal is strongly endorsed by Basketball Victoria and our local sporting clubs.

The stadium extension is part of the Casey Basketball Association Master Plan which has over 700 domestic teams, over 6,500 participants and 1 million annual visitors.

Berwick Basketball Club President, Mr Matthew Loukas, has written a letter of support as this would provide sufficient indoor courts in the Berwick area for the anticipated growth over the next 10 years.

The extension would also include an additional purpose built Dance Studio on the mezzanine level for our growing numbers of Dance Academy students.


Although this extension could cost around \$8 million or more, our College Council believes the seamless and planned integration of sport and education is an invaluable investment in the health and wellbeing of future generations of young people and the wider community.

Ms Bolch will continue to raise the needs of the community with members of parliament and if our parents could also do the same, we may see our plans come to fruition in the near future.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- · \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

Limits

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

Landing Patterns at Berwick College

What is your morning landing pattern, right after you get to work? Is it getting the same car park? A coffee on the way to work? Checking emails as soon as you arrive? It is highly likely that this same pattern of events remains consistent daily, weekly and yearly. Now imagine that you are blocked from completing one or two of these things on any particular morning. Often it can make us feel uneasy, nervous or even ill-prepared for the day ahead. It is the same experience for your child at school.

Remote learning highlighted the need for staff and students to adapt to a changing world. It was a valuable time as it demanded schools reflect on the value of routine, the development of productive learning environments and the teaching of 21st Century skills which would allow students access to learning.

On the back of this, our College has begun to deliver a new process to students which will address each of these areas. At Berwick College, students will begin a new morning routine in homegroup called a 'Landing Pattern'. This is largely driven by Berwick College's belief that as educators we have an obligation to prepare students with the practical skills and behaviours they will need outside of school, in a workplace and beyond.

What is a Landing Pattern?

A landing pattern is a set series of behaviours that are typically performed in regular, successive order which allows an individual the opportunity to settle into an environment or prepare for a task. In essence, students at Berwick College are developing a series of specific morning routines which will act to develop 21st Century skills while concurrently allowing a more established preparedness for their day.

Why are routines important?

Routines are well documented in their benefits for an individual. It has been suggested that:

- A routine helps to simplify a complex environment and inform students exactly what to expect.
- Routines help to create smoother transitions between activities and therefore allow fewer opportunities for disruptions to occur.
- When students are expected to complete routine tasks, they have the opportunity to learn greater responsibility and more self-management skills.
- Creating predictable scenarios through routine allows your mind to adjust by knowing what is going to happen, therefore, alleviating anxiety over the unknown.
- Routine helps alleviate stress. Creating routines will allow you to set times for specific tasks and allow you to set times for fun.

What does the Landing Pattern look like at Berwick College?


Landing Patterns will specifically take place every morning in homegroup, with an expected time of around 5 minutes.

When a student gets to class, it is expected that the teacher will begin with 'Good Morning students, please open your devices and begin your landing patterns.'

At this point students will:

- 1. Check emails (send, receive)
- 2. Check Compass (room changes? due dates? CRT?)
- 3. Check Google Classroom (if applicable).

Year 12 Orientation Day

Year 12 students were also given the opportunity to hear from career counsellors from Federation University who provided further insight into career paths and fields available should students choose to complete tertiary studies.

Following the day, year 12 students were excited to be finishing their last year of schooling and were looking forward to seeing how the year would play out.






Flynn Phoenix Learning Team










Hollows Hawks Learning Team

INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES

We want to thank parents and students for the great job they have done in keeping our school as safe as possible by following important COVIDSafe measures such as mask wearing, physical distancing, ventilation, getting vaccinated and rapid antigen testing. This has meant that our school has remained open and our students in class. This is a fantastic outcome and a testament to the hard work of parents, carers, students and school staff.

Rapid antigen tests

To keep schools as safe as possible, the Victorian Government has extended the COVIDSafe measures introduced for the beginning of Term 1. This includes extending the availability of free rapid antigen tests (RAT) for screening until the end of term. It is anticipated an additional 24 million RATs will be provided to schools and early childhood settings to continue to support early detection and prevent infection, for use at home.

The need for this program will continue to be monitored, and may end earlier based on health advice. This is great news and will mean we're able to continue identifying COVID-19 cases as early as possible, reducing the impact on our school and individuals.

Department of Health modelling indicates that in the first two weeks of school returning, the program has already prevented more than 21,000 cases in schools alone. Their modelling indicates, assuming a 75 per cent compliance rate with screening of students, that by continuing RAT screening in schools for the full 10 weeks of Term 1, we will prevent:

- 61,000 COVID-19 infections in children aged 5 to 17
- more than 150,000 COVID-19 infections in the overall community (on average 15,000 per week over 10 weeks, or more than 2,100 per day)
- around 400 hospital admissions.

The department will continue to supply RATs to our school for your use.

Twice-a-week testing continues to be strongly recommended for both students and staff.

Testing will be conducted at home, and students and staff must report any positive result. There is no requirement to report a negative result.

Vaccination

Vaccination is another key component to protect students and staff in school settings. Vaccinations for children aged 5 to 11 are open and third dose vaccinations for 16 to 17 year olds are now available. There are lots of convenient options to access vaccinations. These include state-wide vaccination hubs, your local GP or pharmacy.

You can book your appointment in a few different ways, including:

- online: coronavirus.vic.gov.au/vaccine
- by phone: 1800 675 398 (Coronavirus Hotline)
- In person: talk to your local pharmacy, doctor, or attend a state-wide vaccination hub.
- using the COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic Finder COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic Finder | Australian Government Department of Health

In addition, schools provide a trusted place among the community to access vaccination, particularly for families who may experience language or social barriers. Following successful implementation of school pop-up clinics at the commencement of Term 1, more than 230 schools across Victoria are currently hosting mini-vaccination clinics led by GPs and pharmacists. Many of these clinics will also make vaccinations available the broader school community, inclusive of families of students and school staff.

Ventilation

Improving ventilation is one of the most effective measures to keep education settings safe. 51,000 air purifiers were delivered to schools by Term 1, 2022 to support COVIDSafe settings in schools.

Up to an additional 60,000 air purifiers will be rolled out to schools ahead of winter to supplement natural and mechanical ventilation during the cooler months. The winter allocation will provide enough purifiers to cover all classrooms, in government schools and low-fee non-government schools based on current enrolments. This includes general purpose classrooms and other specialist classrooms such as art and science rooms.

Mask rules will remain the same, with students in Grade 3 and above required to wear masks – although they will not be required outdoors.

On behalf of the school, I would like to thank you again for your continued support in helping your child to complete the rapid antigen tests and other COVID Safe measures. As a result of these efforts our school can continue providing a safe environment for students and staff.

Careers Education/VET News

Year 12

During Term1 year 12 students will be participating in a post-secondary careers transition session, which includes completing a Career Action Plan (CAP) via a Webex online meeting after school. Within the CAP, the students will be researching courses, training or employment requirements to support their applications to either the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC - for those students applying to university or TAFE), the Police Force, Defence Force, Apprenticeship or workplace.

It is important that all students participate in a session during Term 1 and complete their

CAP as this prepares students for their second careers education session in Term 3. During the second session, students will receive support applying to their preferred institute and/or workplace. This is an integral part of the year 12 transition from secondary school to further education, training or the workplace, and involves identifying any necessary requirements to enter institutions or organisations related to each students preferred career choice. These requirements may include Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank (ATAR) and pre-requisite subjects/study scores required for entry into university courses, as well as any necessary external tests, interviews, portfolios, auditions or other requirements.

All students are required to join the year 12 Careers Education Google Classroom at the start of the year to support their transition. Please ensure your son or daughter has joined this classroom.

Year 11

During Term 1, year 11 students will complete their Career Action Plan (CAP) in class to support their in-school and post-school pathways related to their preferred career choices. The students will use the Berwick College Careers page, supported by Career Tools, to research their preferred subjects and the occupations that relate to their favourite subject areas. This included investigating the role and responsibilities, personal requirements and education and training pathways related to their chosen occupation/s. These sessions support students with their choices at course counselling later in the year regarding programs and subjects.

Year 10

Year 10 students will complete their Career Action Plan during class time during Term 2. Whilst completing their Career Action Plan students begin to set goals and then clarify actions related to occupations they have identified using the Berwick College Careers page/Career Tools, including an initial investigation into education and training pathways. These sessions support students with their choices at course counselling later in the year regarding programs and subjects.

Year 9

Year 9 students will complete their Career Action Plan during Term 3. During these sessions students will complete a Career Action Plan which includes goal setting and clarifying actions related to occupations they have identified using the Berwick College Careers page/Career Tools, including an initial investigation into education and training pathways. These sessions support students with their choices at course counselling later in the year regarding programs and subjects.

Year 9 My Career Insights - Morrisby Profiling.

What is My Career Insights – Morrisby Profiling?

My Career Insights is a program for all year 9 students in Victorian Government Secondary Schools. My Career Insights helps students to discover, develop and drive their career planning. It is a unique opportunity for students to learn more about their strengths and abilities, while exploring potential career options — giving them the confidence to start taking control of their future. This is an ideal time for students to take a moment to reflect on who they are, and what they might want from a career. It is a time for self-discovery and an opportunity to think about their strengths and find new ones.



Welcome back to all students for the 2022 school year. Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) is a major requirement for students in the Applied Learning Programs in years 10, 11, and 12 for the 2022 year and moving forward. It provides a great opportunity for young people to connect with Industry, develop additional skills centred on Employability Skills, and allows a student at least one day a week to connect with external employers. SWL is about pathways and career decisions linking to their school subjects. It is also a fantastic way for young people to bring skills and knowledge back into Berwick College.

There are minimum requirements placed around SWL for everyone's safety.

Students, parents, and employers <u>must complete</u> relevant SWL agreement forms, travel forms, COVID-19 forms and Safe at Work Certificates and then return this information prior to any commencement of SWL in any workplace.

All forms/information can be collected from Mr Gary Brittle, SWL Coordinator/Careers Advisor in the Careers office located in the Senior School Building at the College. Please ensure all areas of the forms are completed and then returned to Mr Brittle only. If you have any questions relating to SWL or work placement Mr Brittle can be contacted on 8768 1087.

VET (Vocational Education and Training)

Our students have started VET for 2022, both internally at Berwick College as well as externally with other providers. We wish our VET students all the best with their chosen courses!

VET at Berwick College for Years 10, 11 and 12 students

Approximately 280 students have elected to undertake a Vocational Education Course at our school or another Technical Educational setting this year. Students are currently undertaking the following 1 or 2 year courses:

At Berwick College

Applied Fashion Design and Technology, Automotive, Community Services, Construction Pathways, Dance, Electrotechnology, Outdoor Recreation, Small Business and Visual Arts.

• Off Campus at another school or TAFE institution

Animal Studies, Beauty, Computer Assembly Repair, Early Childhood Education and Care, Engineering, Equine, Furniture Making, Health Services, Heavy and Light Rail Fundamentals, Information Technology, Kitchen Operations (Patisserie), Make Up, Plumbing, Retail Operations, Salon Assistant (Hairdressing) and Sport and Recreation.

The benefits of undertaking a VET program whilst at school are:

- They assist students to become 'job ready' thereby increasing their employment prospects.
- They form part of recognised pathways to further education and training.
- Upon successful completion, students receive a nationally accredited qualification.
- A necessity within the Applied Learning Program for years 11 and 12 that contributes to units of credit required to obtain an Intermediate and/or Senior Certificate.


