## **Principal's Report**

With just four weeks to go of Term 1, staff have begun to finalise assessments and complete interim reports in preparation for Parent/Student/Teacher conferences.

Our students and staff are enjoying the opportunities that this year has brought with year 11 students undertaking weekly dance sessions, with the support of The Rotary Club of Berwick and coordinators, Ms Kylie Duncan and Ms Amy Pyke, in preparation

for the Presentation Balls next term; interschool sport, Year 9 & VET Dance Triple Bill performance, environmental research tasks and field trips to Cardinia Reserve and Akoonah Park, Outdoor Education activities such as Kayaking, Scuba camp, Division swimming and our Dance Academy students have commenced the Victorian State Schools Spectacular rehearsals. The upcoming year 7 camps will also assist in building positive relationships between students and staff.

The weather was resplendent for the Swimming Carnival, which was an excellent opportunity to build connections with our students, to connect them with their Learning Teams and for our year 12s to celebrate and participate in their last Swimming Carnival. My thanks to our Sports Coordinator, Mr Jesse Ramirez, for organising the day. The Learning Team results are on page 4—Congratulations O'Donoghue!

Our staff enjoyed the recent Professional Learning Day which was themed "Responsive Teaching" with Educational Consultant, Bronwyn Ryrie Jones. Staff were given the opportunity to work together to gain insights from cognitive science and the impact on working and long-term memory. Staff challenge themselves every day to be as effective as they possibly can in all facets of their teaching practice, and the final session on different responsive teaching techniques to show students what success looks like and tracking student thinking during lessons was particularly valuable. My thanks to Assistant Principal, Mrs Cassandra Marinopoulos, for organising the high-quality professional learning day.

On this day, staff were treated to an amazing morning tea organised by City Life Church to thank staff for the work they do, and to recognize teachers and support staff.

They also run our breakfast club for our students each week. In a world where there is so much negative news, it means a lot to have people say thank you and offer to help us with our students out of the goodness of their hearts.

On Tuesday, 1st March, our student leaders pledged

to make a positive difference to our school community, as role models for our College ICARE values, and in supporting the activities of Learning Teams and Teaching and Learning. We also awarded students with a bronze, silver or gold pin as part of the Reward and Recognition Program. We are very proud of each one of you. ## **Principal's Report**

Our senior staff have begun work to support the DET transformation of senior secondary schooling in Victoria and the implementation of Senior Secondary Pathways Reforms which will ensure every student has the skills they need to find rewarding careers and reach their full potential. There will be a new integrated senior secondary certificate in 2023, which will be fully integrated by 2025.

This will bring together our Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) and Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning (VCAL) certificates and the introduction of a VCE

Vocational Major and a Victorian Pathways Certificate (VPC) across government schools. There are different steps we need to take along this journey and we look forward to explaining these changes to students and parents next term in preparation for 2023 course counselling.

After all of this activity, we will all be ready to relax briefly for this long weekend, returning rejuvenated to continue with determination to ensure higher quality learning outcomes for all our students.





## **Positive Climate for Learning**










## O'Donoghue Otellas Learning Team






## **Mighty Monash Learning Team**

This year students challenged themselves during the Annual College Swimming Carnival, held at the Doveton Pool in the Park.







# FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

# CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

#### The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

## **HOW TO APPLY**

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
