We look forward to celebrating their rite of passage, Valedictory, in the next few weeks. Each student joins an extensive alumni across 45 years.

I recently caught up with Nufar Gofman (class of 2014) who recently graduated as a lawyer and was mentored by a past student Kim Lloyd (nee Atkins—class of 1994). Nufar was also my mentor student in year 12 where I encouraged her to keep stepping towards her dreams. We continue to enjoy catching up with alumni who are living successful lives, contributing positively to the community, and speak fondly of their time at Berwick, often saying it was work experience or a teacher who inspired them to enter their chosen career.



The past four weeks have been filled with a number of positive events such as the Dance Academy Junior Production 'Twisted Tales'. We have plans to showcase the abilities of our talented students in an assembly later this term.

The Art and Technology week exhibition, as well as lunchtime and home group activities, was enjoyed by students and staff. Ms Kyra Dawson was presented with a Berwick Community Award by Brad Battin MP, acknowledging her incredible work with our young people and the wider community. The fundraiser for the Ovarian Cancer Research Foundation organised by the year 10 Surf Rescue class with Ms Hinde was a testament to the generosity of our school community, raising \$4,815.

While we did not win first prize for the Outstanding Inclusive Education team or Outstanding Early Career Secondary Teacher for either categories, we are in the top three in the State. Congratulations to the LSO team and to Ms Taylah Quinn on this wonderful achievement.



Term 4 is equally focussed on finishing the year well and on preparing for 2023. Student Leadership applications are being reviewed for a variety of roles and we are starting to appoint new staff to positions vacant in 2023.

We are excitedly looking to building up our high-quality resources in the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) fields, with a particular focus on Environmental Science and Engineering, through a generous donation from a past student to ensure we have the resources to inspire our students in these fields for years to come.

The next project on our list is to get an extension to the basketball stadium. It is in our Masterplan and is also on the City of Casey's Edwin Flack precinct plan but unfortunately we have no funding yet. As a large and connected community we can use our collective voice to encourage our politicians to help us to provide a much-needed resource in the City of Casey that will also benefit our own students and our school in general.

The most recent meeting of the Berwick College Council was at the College on Tuesday, 18th October 2022.

Prior to the meeting College Council President Mr Phil Wightman and council members visited The Arts and Technology exhibition with congratulations and acknowledgement to the teachers and students for their hard work this year.

Students, **Jordan, Chelsea, Ariel, Stefan and Ethan**, supported by Ms Hann and Ms Berwick from the inaugural Environmental Tour presented to council a detailed report of their experience. The tour was unanimously considered a trip of a lifetime.

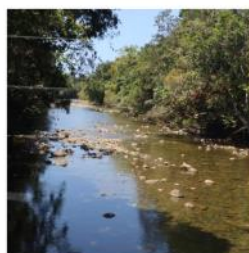
The meeting agenda followed the standard format and contents. This included a report from the principal about the key activities and achievements since the last meeting, reports from the council's sub committees (Policy and Planning, Facilities, Finance and Chaplaincy) and from student members.

Highlights of the meeting include:

- Meetings with local politicians continue to take place to highlight the need for funding an extension to our stadium to accommodate the projected future growth of 62% of domestic teams by 2027 by the Basketball Victoria.
- Reviewing the Sun Protection policy to ensure the processes in place provided robust protection for staff and students.
- Approval for maintenance staff to begin the renovations to the B Block toilets to become non-binary. The student leadership team has been instrumental in bringing the need for non-binary toilets to council members' attention.
- Council thanked Mr Jetmar for his 14+ years of service as Chaplain within the wellbeing team. Council members support the school seeking the views of the wider school community regarding chaplaincy and approved the provision of the Year 9 'Be Wise' presentation.
- Council members acknowledged Ms Walters four years as parent member on council and Ebony Walters as student member this year. Their active involvement, commitment and service to Council has contributed to the positive working environment of council members as they seek to make decisions in the best interests of students and the whole school community.

The next meeting of the College Council is Tuesday 15th November, 2022.

ICARE Program at Berwick College Bullying Prevention and Response

Berwick College is committed to providing a safe and respectful learning environment where bullying will not be tolerated. We actively promote a positive and welcoming personal environment for all members of the College community.

Throughout 2022 part of the College's intervention and response has been to provide the students with an opportunity to anonymously report and identify both a bully and a victim. This has been undertaken in terms 1 and 3 through our whole school Bullying Survey. During homegroup students participated in a bullying prevention workshop. This involved giving students an understanding of what bullying is, what can be done to stop bullies, how to support their peers and where they can go for support.

After this workshop, students were provided an opportunity to complete the Bullying Survey. The data from this survey has been collated and is now being actioned amongst the Student Learning Leaders and Wellbeing team. All students who were identified as demonstrating repeated "bullying" behaviour will be spoken to and individual plans put in place to see this behaviour cease. Students identified as a "victim" of bullying, will be spoken to by a member of the Wellbeing team. They will be offered individual support as required.

We would like to encourage any student who may be experiencing, or students who have witnessed bullying behaviour to promptly report their concerns to a staff member or trusted adult as soon as possible.

Other measures that will be taken this term to promote positive and respectful behaviour is the delivery of the 'Be wise' presentation to our year 9 cohort, from the Pat Cronin foundation. This seeks to address the impacts of violence and anti-social behaviours and challenge our students to choose to "be wise", giving them tools on how to respond when faced with conflict.

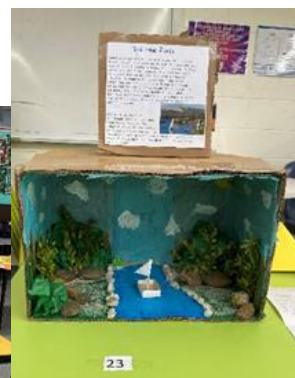
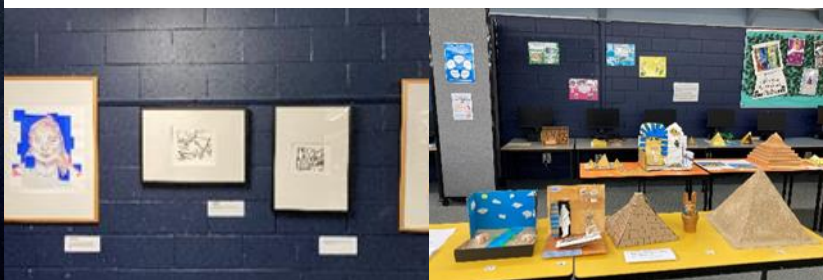
Overdue library books and resources

O'Donoghue Otellas Learning Team

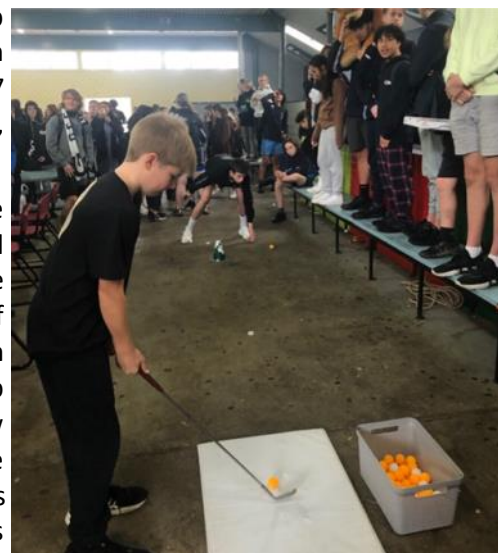

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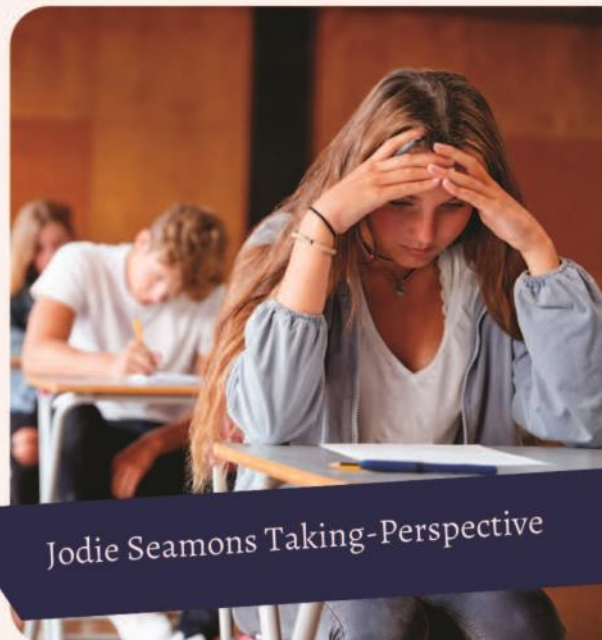
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
