Principal's Report

I am very grateful to staff, students and families who are being so supportive as we manage the impact of staff shortages. We are doing everything we can to ensure our students are not

missing out on their learning and I thank you for your forbearance.

Thank you to all of our families who attended Parent Teacher Interviews, either in person or on line, at the end of last term. If you missed out on that opportunity you are still welcome to contact your child's teachers to discuss your child's progress. We are three weeks into term 2 and already our school community has observed ANZAC Day commemorations and the annual Cross Country. My thanks to Humanities Domain Leader, Mr Rafal Kaplon, and Sport Coordinator, Ms Claise Janssen, respectively, for their organisation of these events. The Dunlop Learning Team celebrated Dunlop Day in a sea of yellow and organised activities to support Sir Edward 'Weary' Dunlop Medical Research Foundation. Dunlop were also joint first place winners with O'Donoghue in the Learning Team point tally, with Chisholm coming a close second by just one point.



Wellbeing in Focus

The Mental Health & Wellbeing newsletter was provided to families during the term break. The articles on promoting mental health and wellbeing at home and available supports for a range of wellbeing areas are important resources to refer to as your child progresses through adolescence.

LifeChanger is a registered DBR status charity, founded by Scott Watters and Trevor Hendy in 2017. LifeChanger's mission is to create a generational shift in our society by focussing on positive psychology to 'Awaken the Hero' that lives within Australian Youth. These workshops aim to build resilience by empowering teenagers through a positive self-identity.

Student learning

As a staff we prioritise student learning while offering extracurricular activities that help our students to grow. Although it has been necessary to reduce the amount of activities provided to students this term to ensure our teachers are available for classes, students have enjoyed interschool and School Sport Victoria competitions in netball, tennis, soccer, Girls' AFL and baseball. Year 12 Environmental Science students continue to visit the research site on Inglis Road to collect data for their SAC. Year 12 Biology students participated in a variety of experiments to investigate human immunology at Federation University. 





YEAR 10 DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY- ROBOTICS DESIGN TASK


















Year 10 Wood Technology with Mr Wolstenholme

Year 10 Wood Technology students have been busy designing and creating their own tables for their first CAT. Students have made some very clever and appealing pieces of furniture.



SAFE@WORK CERTIFICATES—What are they?

Any student undertaking work experience is legally required to complete their Safe@Work General and Industry Specific Certificates. These Certificates need to be completed every year, ensuring students are familiar with WHS Requirements of each industry, how to respond to workplace risks, how to be aware of their work surroundings and what their safety responsibilities are. Students must complete both these certificates online and must get a copy to their Work Experience Coordinator before placement commences. If students do not complete both assessments, they will be unable to attend work experience.
