#### **Principal's Report**



"We aim to offer all our students the greatest choices available to optimise pathway options, engage our students and maximise learning outcomes".

Planning for the 2024 year continues with transition meetings with grade 6 teachers scheduled for later this term, and the selection of 2024 course pathways and subjects by students with parents and staff this week. Through the outstanding Careers Education Expo for years 9 to 12, parent information sessions and course counselling afternoons, we aim to offer all our students the greatest choices available to optimise pathway options, engage our

students, maximise learning outcomes and stimulate learning. In many cases the pathways will change over the years. Our leadership and careers staff work with students in every year level throughout the year to help students identify and pursue their goals and make a successful transition into the next year level or further education, training and employment.

Over the past four weeks students have experienced a wide range of extra-curricular activities such as regional finals in Soccer, Netball and AFL; a VET Community Services excursion to the Salvation Army; competed in the State Cross Country; participated in mentoring sessions and the Year 12 Wellbeing Day, and Dance students enjoyed a workshop provided by Patrick Studios to enhance their connection with industry experts. Congratulations to the **Basketball Academy** students and coaches of the Intermediate Boys' and Intermediate Girls' teams who competed in the Champions Cup this week and won their tournaments, qualifying for the 'Elite 8'.

The whole school assembly to celebrate NAIDOC, and the Cleansing Ceremony near our learning stone and indigenous garden, were both excellent celebrations of our Koorie students, families and local culture.









We wish year 11 student **Justin Wilson all the very best in** the upcoming National Worldskills Australia competition in the VETiS category of Metals and Engineering. Each competitor will be tested on their skills in welding components and assessed on different facts of the project including workplace health and safety, sizes and tolerances of components and workmanship.

The recent Professional Learning Day was a valuable day for staff to collaborate and review student data. I am keen to continue providing staff and students with the tools and strategies to help

students with dyslexia to have learning and personal growth. The consultant from Thoughtful Works brought a depth of knowledge and stories on dyslexia that will be a great resource for our staff and benefit to our students.

Learning Team days such as the recent highly successful Chisholm Day and later this term Hollows, O'Donoghue and Flynn Learning Team days, are invaluable in fostering the positive relationships between students and teachers, bringing a greater sense of belonging and connectedness as well as fundraising for a cause in the wider community.

The College will continue to analyse feedback from DE surveys, including the online Parent Opinion Survey which will be open from Monday, 7th August to Friday, 8th September, and the Bullying Prevention Survey which is issued twice a year, Term 1 and 3, to assist us in making important improvements and address any student behaviour issues. We value our school community's views and suggestions.

Observations from the hundreds of parents who take part in our school tours, many of whom are past students, are always positive and encouraging. I am very grateful for our dedicated teaching and support staff, who together with the principal class, are working together to ensure students are achieving personal growth and improved learning outcomes. **Ms Kerri Bolch - Principal**

#### Parent Seminar – Managing Challenging Teenagers – Feedback!

We want to extend a big thank you to all the parents who attended and supported our parent seminar on managing challenging teenagers. It was great to be able to get together and It has been wonderful to have such positive feedback from parents and carers.

Hearing Michael's story and listening to the experiences that his parents went through was both emotive and insightful. Michael shared his journey of struggling with mental health issues as a child, turning to drugs, and ultimately being incarcerated. Despite the challenges he faced, Michael's story serves as a testament to the power of resilience and the human spirit.

One take home message was as parents or carers, to go with your gut feeling. If you think there is something not quite right with your child, ask; keep asking, seek help and take the time to find the right professional for your child or family. **Prevention is key.** If we can identify early, that something is going on, it is a lot easier to find a solution. The other take home message was to encourage parent collaboration.

# Reach out, talk to people, don't allow shame or embarrassment to stop you from seeking support. It takes a village to raise a child!



"It's not often you hear a business-minded demographer endorse theatre as the most important school subject. But late in 2021, in an interview with the ABC on the future of work in the age of technology, that's exactly what Australian demographer Simon Kuestenmacher did.

Responding to questions about which skills will be prized by future tech employers, Kuestenmacher argued: 'The most important subject in school is not necessarily maths or science to survive in the tech world. #### YEAR 10 GAME OF LIFE WORK EXPERIENCE TERM 3

All year 10 Game of Life students are required to participate in our Work Experience Program from the 11th September - 15th September.

By now, all students have participated in a class information session. Students have been provided with all the work experience forms including information on how to search, contact and apply for work experience. This is their first opportunity to put themselves out there and make contact with employers. Students need to organise work experience, return their forms and have their Safe@Work Certificates done by Friday, 18th August, for processing and school signing.

If your child intends to do any work on a building or construction site, please contact Ms Maddie McKeon to arrange their White Card Training Qualification, which they can do at the school on Monday, 14th August. This is a legal requirement for anyone intending to complete work or learning on a building site and it is also a great idea to get your child to complete this training now, if it's something they are looking at doing in the future.

#### VET COMMUNITY SERVICES RSPCA EXCURSION
