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Principal's Report



"I am very proud of what is being accomplished in the life of our College, and of the way our staff and students support each other".

Recently, I attended the Southern Melbourne Area Principal Forum where the focus was on the implementation of the Senior Secondary Pathway Reforms. Our vision of preparing each student for diverse pathway choices and to make a successful transition into further education, training and employment is supported by careers staff, leaders and education support staff who all work with students and families to ensure our young people can explore

a variety of career pathways that best align with their strengths and interests.

One of the ways we implement a safe and orderly learning environment for all members of our learning community is through shared expectations for student behaviour, applied through the School Wide Positive Behaviour Support program and all members upholding our ICARE values and processes. Green Chronicles, EPIC (Every Period In Class) and Reward and Recognition awards are all visible reminders of student achievement and growth as we demonstrate these shared values.

The consistent wearing of school uniform has been an emphasis this term to continue to build a sense of belonging and an inclusive and supportive learning environment. Due to recommendations from the students, the uniform and dress code policy has been updated with College Council approval on Tuesday, 15th August. My thanks to our students and parents for supporting, respecting and abiding by our uniform policy. A reminder that parents seeking exemptions to the uniform policy and student dress code due to religious beliefs, ethnic or cultural background, student disability, gender, health condition or economic hardship must apply in writing to me, and if possible, we will endeavour to provide appropriate support for this matter.

Our staff also consistently review data to ascertain if there are gaps in skills and knowledge or learning barriers that prevent a student from achieving positive outcomes. The Bullying Prevention week with the presentations from the Pat Cronin Foundation and Dollys Dream, 'Kick for Connection' soccer match and recent parent forum on cyber safety, all assist in building student resilience and strengthening the health and wellbeing of students. We welcome parent and carer feedback on the confidential DE Parent Opinion Survey which asks questions around elements of the school experience for students and parents. Our NAPLAN results have proven to be highly pleasing, particularly in the area of year 9 writing. Well done to staff, students and parents for their involvement in this assessment process.

Term 3 has continued with opportunities for students to experience a wide range of extra-curricular activities such as interschool and School Sport Victoria National competitions, the Basketball Academy competing in the Champions Cup, Outdoor Education students enjoying Cross Country Skiing, indoor rock climbing, cycling at Lysterfield lake, a VET Dance excursion to see the performance 'Moulin Rouge', year 12 Biology students excursion to the Melbourne Zoo to analyse, compare and contrast primate evolution, Humanities students visiting the Holocaust Museum and Victorian State School Spectacular rehearsals.

The Hollows Learning Team Day raised over \$1,700 for the charity The Fred Hollows Foundation and towards the end of the term, both the Flynn and O'Donoghue Teams will do the Walk for Watarrka, raising much needed funds for the Watarrka Foundation who deliver educational programs to support Indigenous children and their communities in outback central Australia. The year 11 Market Day will also be raising funds for the RSPCA and Breast Cancer Foundation Australia.

The last three weeks of this term will pass very quickly, and we strongly encourage parents and students to book promptly for Parent Student Teacher Conferences, Thursday 14th September (Student Free to enable a Professional Practice Day for teachers) from 4:30 to 8:00pm and Friday 15th September, (Student Free Day), from 9:00am to 2:30pm. These conferences are an opportunity to provide feedback on your child's progress and goals for this year. Compass opens on Monday 4th September to make on-line bookings for interviews and Mid Semester progress reports will be available by Friday 1st September.

In the term break, year 12 VCE students have access to the September Holiday Exam and Revision Preparation Program and I encourage them all to attend. I am very proud of what is being accomplished in the life of our College, and of the way our staff and students support each other and we look forward to concluding a very successful Term Three.

Berwick College Council Report

The most recent meeting of the Berwick College Council was at the College on Tuesday, 15th August 2023.

The College Council is the governing body of the school. It is responsible for developing and maintaining policies that assist and direct the operations of the school.

Victorian government schools are child safe environments. Our College actively promotes the safety and wellbeing of all students, and all school staff are committed to protecting students from abuse or harm in the school environment, in accordance with their legal obligations, including child safe standards. The Child Safe Standards were explained by Assistant Principal, Mr Andrew Barker, to ensure Council Members were aware of their duty of care to protect young people and their role relating to four specific standards.

The meeting agenda followed the standard format and contents. This included a report from the principal about the key activities and achievements since the last meeting, noting the work that is being undertaken to identify and support students with dyslexia, reports from the Council's sub committees (Policy and Planning, Facilities and Finance) and from student members.

Council members actively welcome students providing genuine feedback that will contribute to a positive learning environment and culture for present and future students. The student report presented by Emma Guthrie and Teaghan Glassenbury provided the three recommendations from the Student Congress that had been approved for Council consideration.

- 1. The return of the rugby jumper to academic uniform from sport only
- 2. Additional tables/chairs and outdoor activities for students to do
- 3. Upgrade of the bathroom facilities

Students had found the Congress process a positive experience to voice their ideas. Council members, which include parent members as representatives of the parents in the school community, endorsed the return of the rugby jumper.

All sessions run in E3 and will continue to run for the remainder of the term. Please see the white board in the Senior Study Area for a schedule of these sessions and sign up sheets.


Hollows Hawks Learning Team

COMMUNITY POLICE REMINDER—E-SCOOTERS...

E-scooters are only legal for people over 16years and older. Riders of an e-scooter must wear a helmet, ride at a maximum speed of 20km/hour and must have flashing or steady front and rear lights if riding at night or in low-light. Riders <u>must not</u>: ride on the footpath, use a mobile phone while riding, ride while under the influence of drugs or alcohol, carry passengers, animals or ride in tandem and ride on roads with a speed limit over 60km/h. Anyone over the age of 14 can be issued an infringement notice for breaching these rules. <u>Rules and penalties: VicRoads</u>


Flynn Phoenix Learning Team

families and maybe watching all their high school productions, like 'Salmon Enchanted Evening' one more time!






























