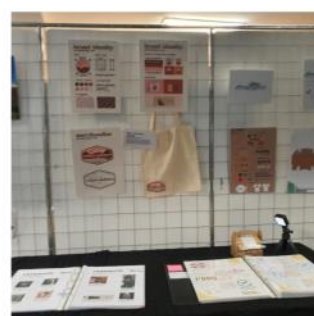
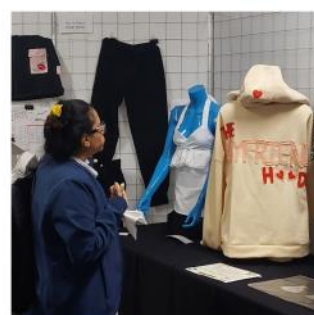

Please check carefully and ensure you are on time to ALL EXAMS.

**Year 11 VCE students** are not required to attend classes during the exam period.

**VCE VM:** Year 11 VM classes will not run as all students will be on Work Placement

**VET classes in the timetable Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday will not run during week 6 and week 7 (exam week):** VET classes blocked on Wednesdays will still run and all VCE VM students are expected to attend Work Placement on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday in both week 6 and 7.

### Year 10 students undertaking a Year 11 subject

Year 10 students completing a Unit 1/2 subject will attend all normal Yr10 classes through the week. On the date of the exam they will attend the allocated session. Students must inform their usual teacher that they will be absent due to the exam. Year 11 classes that have 5 or more Year 10 students will continue to run as per normal sessions. 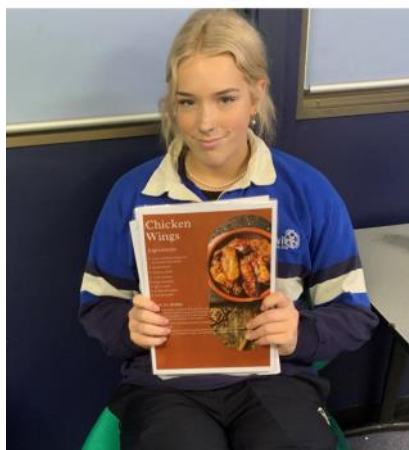

## ICARE Values at Berwick College Bullying Prevention and Response

Berwick College is committed to providing a safe and respectful learning environment where bullying will not be tolerated. We actively promote a positive and welcoming personal environment for all members of the College community.

Throughout 2023 part of the College's intervention and response has been to provide the students with an opportunity to anonymously report and identify

both a bully and a victim. This has been undertaken in terms 1 and 3 through our whole school Bullying Survey. Students have participated in a bullying prevention workshop which involved providing students with an understanding of what bullying is, what can be done to stop bullies, how to support their peers and where they can go for support.

After this workshop, students were provided an opportunity to complete the Bullying Survey. The data from this survey has been collated and is now being actioned amongst the Student Learning Leaders and Wellbeing team. All students who were identified as demonstrating repeated "bullying" behaviour will be spoken to and individual plans put in place to see this behaviour cease. Students identified as a "victim" of bullying, will be spoken to by a member of the Wellbeing team. They will be offered individual support as required.

We would like to encourage any student who may be experiencing, or students who have witnessed bullying behaviour to promptly report their concerns to a staff member or trusted adult as soon as possible.

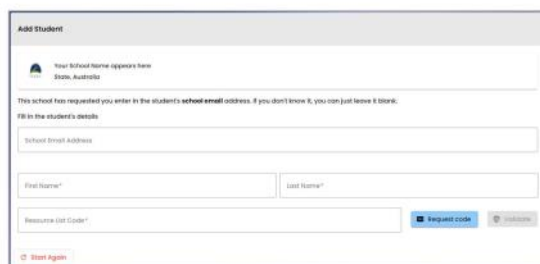
