As you may be aware, the *Mobile Phones – Student Use* policy for Victorian government schools came into effect in Term 1 2020. This policy requires students to switch their phones off and securely store them during the school day. The policy is designed to support teaching and learning, promoting learning environments that are free from unnecessary distractions. The policy also aims to increase physical activity and socialisation at recess and lunch times. A Review of the policy found that it has reduced the use of mobile phones during school hours, with a range of benefits noted by principals and teachers. The Department of Education has also published a parent/carer support page on mobile phones in schools on its <u>website</u>. This website includes links to supports for parents/carers on safe and responsible technology use at home. Our school has its own, local mobile phone policy, which implements the government's mobile policy in line with our local context. 
