## Principal's Report—Josie Millard

*This is a wonderful, vibrant school community.*

As we conclude Term 3, I reflect on my six weeks in the role of Principal at Berwick College. This is a wonderful, vibrant school community. The students have welcomed me warmly. When I first introduced myself to them at an Assembly, I asked them to say 'hello' if they saw me out and about – and they have done so. They have been so generous in their welcome, and they have shown me what a wonderful group of people they are. I have met many, but not yet all, of the staff at Berwick College. I have been involved in many conversations as I have learned about this school and while I have a long way to go, I am beginning to understand the whole school. What is clear, is that both staff and students care deeply about this community. They recognise that the school holds a strong and important role in the Berwick community – and the staff in particular take that responsibility most seriously. Over the course of Term 4, the planning for 2025 will continue to drive our work. I am working closely with the school's Leadership Team to ensure that the 2025 program is set to optimise our student outcomes.

### PARENT TEACHER INTERVIEWS

It was wonderful to meet many parents at the meetings we held at school on Thursday, 19th September. Many teachers commented to me how engaged families were with the education experience of their students. These conversations, and of course the resulting conversations that are held at home afterwards, are so powerful in influencing learning. As a school, we need families to engage in the learning in order for it to be purposeful and engaging. The teachers spent much time preparing for the meetings and I thank them for their professional commitment to the process.

### YEAR 12 – APPROACHING THE FINAL EXAMS

Many of our year 12 students have just completed a practice exam for their English study. They are to attend revision lectures and complete practice exams for their other subjects over the study break.

I would like to remind year 12 students of how much influence they hold over their final results as they enter the final five weeks before their examinations. These five weeks have the potential to be the most influential five weeks of the year. If this time is used carefully and productively, students may make a significant impact on their final exam result.

For the first week of the break students should be reviewing and summarising their notes from across both Unit 3 and Unit 4. They should be identifying areas of knowledge and skill where they need to relearn or improve, and they should be making a study plan for the coming five weeks.

In the second week of the study break, they should be commencing practice exams – at home as well as the ones they complete at the school. The exams that are completed at home should be completed 'open book' and 'open time' at this stage. Students should try to use older practice exams at this stage so that they can save the most recently published exams until the week before their final exam.

Many students will form study groups in the last week of the holidays. This is an extremely effective way of learning. Students are able to ask questions in a safe and supportive environment as well as challenge each other to think deeply and broadly, making connections that they are unable to on their own.

### YEAR 10 AND 11 – APPROACHING EXAMS

Any year 11 students studying a Unit 3 and 4 subject this year, are also encouraged to implement the good study habits over the holiday period. It is not too early to start considering the Unit 2 exams. It is important that year 11 students accept that their work habits fundamentally impact on year 12. Year 10 students should also begin preparing for Semester 2 exams over this break. Students should reflect on their work practices and to consider some changes that could be pledging to:

- concentrate and work effectively in class during Term 4;
- beginning exam preparation earlier;
- changing study routines to focus on understanding of content; and
- increase the number of hours of homework during week nights.

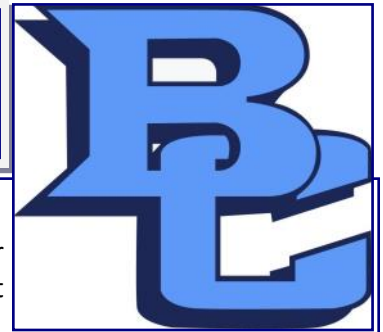

Last Sunday on the 8th of September, the Berwick College Basketball team attended and took out gold in the grand final!!

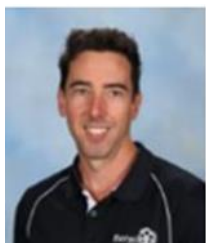

## School Saving Bonus—Verify your details!

Dear Parents and Carers, In Term 4, 2024, families with a child enrolled in a government school from Prep to Year 12 in 2025 will receive the one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus.

The \$400 School Saving Bonus provides families with support for education-related costs, such as school activities and/or school uniforms and textbooks. The School Saving Bonus is not available for full-fee international students, home schooled students, TAFE students and students attending kindergarten in 2025.

**Actions for parents and carers:** Before **18 October 2024**, the Department of Education is asking parents and carers to: Complete enrolment: If your child, or children are changing government school for Term 1 2025, or starting Prep or Year 7 in 2025. **Check your contact information:** Ensure your email address and phone number is up to date with us. You can check this information by contacting us directly. We need to ensure your contact information is up to date as the Department of Education will email you twice, once in October, to verify your email address and again in November, with your \$400 School Saving Bonus and access to an online system.
