Year 11 Outdoor & Environmental Studies

On Wednesday, 13th November, our year 11 Outdoor and Environmental Studies students successfully transformed the Learning Stone Indigenous Garden through a hands-on community project designed by the students themselves!

The students' revegetation project had the clear focus of improving the biodiversity of the area and celebrating the garden space. The students worked tirelessly to remove the invasive weeds and replaced them with native flora species. Notably, they introduced Muntries and Midyim Berries, both of which are native bush tucker species used by Indigenous peoples, along with other native plants like Brachyscome 'Mauve Delight', Westringia fruticosa, Alyogyne, Callistemons and Carpobrotus species.

This initiative not only beautified our school grounds but also enhanced local biodiversity and celebrates the First Nations' value of garden. Additionally, the students installed a bird bath to create a welcoming oasis for native birds. This project exemplifies the practical application of environmental education while deepening our students' connection to Indigenous culture and traditional land management practices.



We encourage the school community to visit the revitalised garden as it serves as a living classroom, offering valuable lessons in Biology, Environmental Science and Indigenous Studies. Please congratulate and celebrate the following students' hard work !

Ready to Learn—Semester Two Update

Berwick College’s ‘Ready To Learn (RTL)’ initiative has continued throughout Semester 2, with staff and students looking to earn points for their respective teams. Over the course of the year, the RTL focus has largely been identified based on school data and connected to the promotion and maintenance of an orderly learning environment. Students have often risen to the challenge, hoping to contribute points towards being the winning team.

In Semester 1, the RTL focus areas included: Attending class on time, engagement during class time, bringing all required materials to class.

In Semester 2, the RTL focus areas have been: staying in class for the duration of the lesson and wearing full school uniform.

STAYING IN CLASS

In 2024, the data suggested that students were asking to leave class with more frequency than other years. Often these were for reasons that could be resolved through improved personal organisation (getting books, class materials, drink bottles etc). It is understood that each time a student asks to leave class, the learning environment is disrupted and this detracts from the learning.

What was pleasing to witness (when viewing the graph pictured to the right) is that the RTL initiative significantly decreased student movements about the school during class time, therefore improving student organisation and maintaining a focus on learning. Overall, student traffic across the school decreased by over 150 students over the three week cycle. An impressive effort in such a short time.



Congratulations to the **Chisholm Learning Team**, who won this cycle – they were the most engaged Learning Team across the school! Their reward was a hot chip lunch!

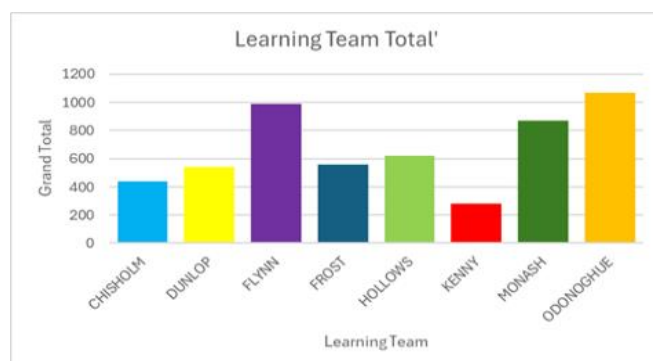
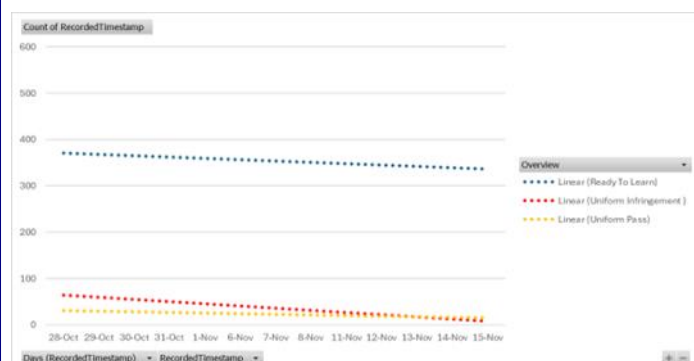
UNIFORM

Wearing the correct school uniform was the second RTL sprint that was completed during Semester 2. Students were expected to wear full school uniform to receive a positive RTL chronicle or were issued with an infringement if not in full uniform.

Some of the key data demonstrates:

1. RTL chronicle entries remained high throughout the entire cycle (only a slight dip at the end). This means that there was great recognition of positive behaviours around the school.
2. There was a decline in 'uniform infringements' issued across the school - this indicates that students were in uniform more frequently across the sprint cycle.
3. The number of uniform passes issued each day was relatively consistent, raising slightly. What was great to see is that towards the end of the cycle, the number of 'uniform passes' outnumbered the amount of 'uniform infringements'.

Congratulations to the **O'Donoghue Learning Team**, who won this cycle! Best Dressed in the school! The students will receive their reward for this achievement in the coming week.

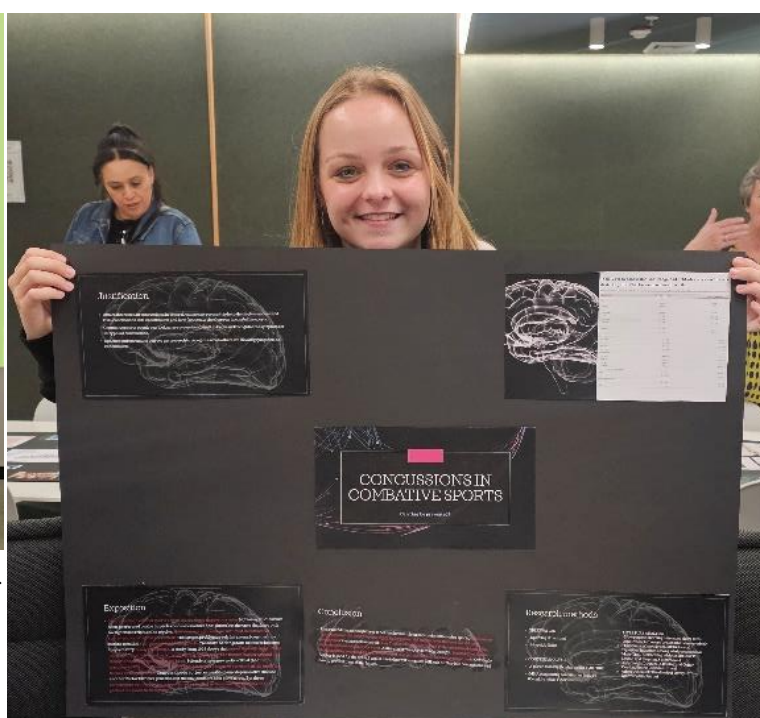
This term, Flynn has come second in the Ready To Learn Cycle – Uniform!

Over the course of the semester, Teaghan researched the topic of 'Concussions in Combat Sports' and presented her findings.

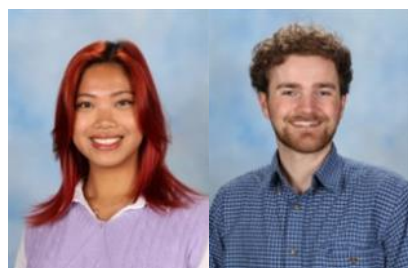
